Ottawa, Oct. 25, 2021 – The 2021 Canada's Most Powerful Women: Top 100 Award Winners list was released by Women's Executive Network today, recognizing 105 outstanding women across Canada who advocate for workforce diversity and inspire tomorrow's leaders. Actua is pleased to announce that its President and CEO, Jennifer Flanagan has been awarded in the Manulife Science and Technology category, which recognizes women in STEM roles who are challenging the status quo for knowledge and female empowerment.
